There is no formal reading list for biology students. The New College library is well-stocked with biology textbooks and you will also have access to all recommended texts through the Radcliffe Science Library. There is, therefore, no need to spend a lot of money on books when you get here. Nevertheless, I thought it might be useful to list a couple of books that are particularly useful in first year, in case you'd like to do some reading over the summer.

I run a "book club" tutorial at the start of Hilary term (January) on "*The Ancestor's Tale*" by Richard Dawkins. This book is a recommended text for the first year course *Organisms*, and the second year course, *Evolution*.

Probably one of the most heavily used text books across all three years of the course is the fourth edition of "*An introduction to behavioural ecology*" by Davies, Krebs and West. It covers those parts of biology that the A-Level syllabus doesn't seem to reach and is very popular with the students.

Quick and easy: Another recommended text for the *Organisms* course is one of the excellent OUP Very Short Introductions on "*Animals*" by Peter Holland.

We will meet again in fresher's week, when I will provide you with detailed information about our tutorial schedule and you will also have the chance to meet the other biology students in college.
