Harlech Scholarship 2019 - 2020

The Harlech Scholars' Trust was founded to commemorate the memory of the late Lord Harlech with the endowment of a transatlantic scholarship. It enables a graduate of New College, Oxford, Lord Harlech's old college, to study for a year at Harvard and for an American graduate to study at New College in alternate years. The next scholar will travel from New College to *Harvard* in *mid-August 2019 for one academic year*.

Applicants must be citizens of the United Kingdom and Commonwealth, unmarried, under the age of 26 on 1 January 2019, and either **(a)** undergraduates at New College who will have completed at least 6 terms' residence on 1 January 2019 or **(b)** immediate graduates of New College, by whom any postgraduate study must be being undertaken at a UK university.

The Harlech Scholar will be a Special Student in the Harvard Graduate School of Arts & Sciences. This, non-degree, option enables up to four of the required eight courses to be taken at other Harvard and MIT graduate schools and also the Fletcher School at Tufts. Lord Harlech had unusual and wide-ranging talents. Trustees would hope to find applicants who have a broad range of interests beyond the purely academic. They want to understand why Harvard specifically appeals given an applicant's academic interests, what benefits there might be from an academic year spent outside the UK and what an applicant would bring to Harvard in addition to a strong academic record.

Applications should comprise:

(a) 9 copies of a curriculum vitae; and

(b) 9 copies of a Personal Statement which particularly addresses the points above. Interviews will probably be held in London during the week beginning Monday 13th January 2019. The successful applicant will then be helped to complete a formal application to Harvard by their deadline of March 1st 2019.
